Pres. Harding agreed to start a comprehensive inventory of Chapter assets at Ed Butterfield's farm. Pres. Harding said it is important to move the chapter's assets to Don Scott Airport. Directors also received an update on plans for the new Ohio History of Aviation Research and Museum from Joe. He plans to meet with the director of the Ohio Historical Society in mid-December to determine the status of aviation artifacts owned by the Society and stored at Port Columbus. Harding says the airport's master plan, which includes the research and museum facility, has yet to be approved by the Ohio State University Board of Trustees. Projected costs and potential contributors are being researched. Directors also discussed organization of a special recognition dinner sometime in January. "We need a time to recognize those who have given of their time and talents to our Chapter," says Al. "We're a volunteer organization and our success rests with our active and very talented members."

Many aircraft owners are finding it necessary to include "named insured" on their aircraft's policies. The economy, cutbacks in coverage by aviation insurance companies, and policy payouts have combined to make insurance coverage a financial challenge for aircraft owners and renters, according to Candy. ## Photo ID Law Now in Effect for Pilots

EAA reminds us that beginning Oct. 18, 2002, all pilots must carry photo identification along with their FAA pilot certificate and medical during flight operations. The FAR specifically says: FAR 61.3(a): Each person must carry a photo identification acceptable to the Administrator when exercising the privileges of a pilot certificate; and FAR 61.3(l): Each person must present such photo identification when requested to do so by the Administrator, an authorized representative of the NTSB or the TSA, or a law enforcement officers. The FAA expects the most commonly used photo ID will be a valid driver's license issued by a U.S. state, D.C., or U.S. territory or possession.
